He started with the quote by Albert Einstein: "Education is not the learning of the facts, but the training of the mind to think". 2] Topic/Event: Awareness Session on Thalassaemia, Speaker: Ms. Sujata Raikar

Session 2: (1.30 PM- 3.00 PM) Venue: Auditorium

Speaker Profile: Social Worker

- Masters in Computer Application from Gujarat
- Founder SAATH Charitable Trust

Biography: Sujata completed her education in Masters in Computer Application from Gujarat. She came to Mumbai post marriage. While doing her regular job, she did not leave the opportunity of doing her bit for the underprivileged in the society. She worked with many NGOs like Make a wish foundation, Vatsalaya, school for blind and so on till she came to know about Thalassaemia in 2008. Thalassaemia affected kids need blood transfusions, medications, blood tests, bone scan and that too for their lifetime. Because of her sensitive nature she decided to dedicate her life for Thalassaemia. As the work increased, she established SAATH charitable trust. Today, through this trust, 90 Thalassaemia patients from extremely poor families are provided medicines and their medical needs are taken care of. She manages work of the trust all by herself.

She has dedicated her life for the Thalassaemia affected kids and has pledged to spread awareness about Thalassaemia in the society. Until now she has given information about Thalassaemia to more than 1 lac people all over Maharashtra.

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Report of the Session:

Ms. Sujata Raikar addressed the gathering for 1.5 hours. In her opening remarks the speaker appreciated the initiatives taken by college for PwD students. The speaker introduced the audience about Thalassaemia, its causes, types, symptoms and treatment. Thalassaemia affected patients need blood transfusions, medications, blood tests, bone scan and that too for their lifetime. She explained the cause of Thalassaemia major- if both the parents are Thalassaemia minor, they have a 25% chance of "passing down" a serious form of disease i.e. Thalassaemia Major to their children, where the child shall require blood transfusion throughout his/her life. It was mentioned that Thalassaemia major cases can be avoided by taking simple precautionary measures. She emphasized that being a Thalassaemia minor is not a problem but not being aware is; so every individual should undergo Thalassaemia minor test before marriage or before planning for a child. Further, she highlighted the activities carried out by SAATH trust that aim CARE and COMFORT of children suffering from Thalassaemia Major. She also shared her experience about the hardship faced by patients suffering from this disorder in getting blood, and appealed the audience to donate blood at least twice a year.

The following were the take away from the session:

- Awareness about Thalassaemia
- Importance of Thalassaemia test in preventing Thalassaemia major cases

The speaker kept the audience engrossed during the session. The talk was truly informational and inspiring.

After the talk, Dr. Prasanna Shete thanked the speaker and briefed the audience about KJSCE Resource Centre for PwD students. He highlighted the objective of the Resource centre, associations with other organisations, activities conducted and projects undertaken. The students were given a glimpse of how technological projects undertaken by the resource centre contribute in facilitating accessibility to the persons with disability.

Usha Andewar: Practicing criminal lawyer in High Court and other criminal courts of Mumbai, Ethical Committee Member for The Humsafar Trust, Kasturba Hospital, Hi Media Laboratories, Dr. Skin Pimple Clinic. Professor (Part-time) Jitendra Chauhan College of Law, SNDT Women's University, Law College, Jayantibai Patel College of Law, KES College Campus, NMIMS School of Law, Mumbai. Member of POSH Committee at Bhavan's College, Pidilite Ltd.,Ultratech Ltd. Appearing as Advocate in various criminal matters in different courts in Mumbai, Family Court at Mumbai, High Court of Bombay etc.

Report of the Session:

Women Development Cell (WDC-KJSCE) conducted a lecture on "Awareness about Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace" for FY BTech students during FY BTech induction program organized by IQAC, KJSCE. It is important to make aware the students about such a sensitive and serious topic. Experts working in this area were invited to give lecture from an organization named Bhartiya Stree Shakti (BSS), Mumbai.

The program started by welcome note by WDC-KJSCE Convener Prof. Jyoti Varavadekar. She also explained activities conducted by WDC-KJSCE every year. Mrs.Ranjana Kanoor a member of BSS introduced about the organization BSS. She also explained different activities and projects done by BSS for a cause of women. Student representative from WDC-KJSCE Ms.Aditi Joisher introduced the next speaker, Adv Usha Andewar. Next, Adv Usha Andewar explained the importance of having awareness about Sexual harassment of women at workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) ACT, 2013.She interacted with the students about this concept. Adv Usha Andewar explained the history of the law, importance of the law. She explained definition of sexual harassment. To clarify the definition of sexual harassment, Adv Usha Andewar narrated the scripts for three different situations and cases of sexual harassment. Adv Usha Andewar also explained that to resolve complaint cases of sexual harassment of women at workplace, Internal Committee (IC) is mandatory in every organization as per law. The constitution of IC as per law was explained. She explained the procedures to submit the complaint cases of sexual harassment to IC, mechanism to resolve the complaint cases by the committee. In case if both complainant and respondent agree to settle the complaint case there is provision of conciliation as per the law. She also explained that for students the law is gender neutral.

Question answer session was open for the students. Questions related to false complaint was addressed by Adv Usha Andewar madam. Some questions were asked about gender equality and law. Adv Usha Andewar answered the questions.

Lastly, Member from WDC-KJSCE Prof. Nandana Prabhu gave vote of thanks. Prof Varavadekar handed over token of appreciation to both the speakers.

The session ended by giving message to the students to say Zero Tolerance to Sexual Harassment of Women at workplace.
