Sub: Approval to K.J. Somaiya College of Engineering, Vidyanagar, Bombay.

Sir,

I am directed to state that, on the recommendations made by the Western Regional Committee (WRC), the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) has accorded approval to the K.J. Somaiya College of Engineering, Vidyanagar, Bombay to conduct the following degree courses in Engineering with the annual intake shown against each from the academic year 1993-94:

S.No.	Name of the Course	Intake
1.	Production Engineering	60(Sixty)
2.	Machine Tools Engineering	30(Thirty)
3.	Electronics Engineering	90(Ninty)

The above approval is given subject to fulfillment of the following conditions:


- (1) The College will provide total 8136 sqm. of plinth area and take-up necessary construction work immediately to remove the deficiencies in the plinth area by June, 1994.
- (2) The teaching staff requirement for 180 annual intake is 72 in the ratio of 1:2:4 (Professor:Asst. Professor:Lecturer). The College shall recruit necessary teaching staff to remove the deficiencies by June, 1994. In case the required faculty is not recruited by the said time, the AICTE will reduce the annual intake to a level corresponding to faculty strength.
- (3) The technical supporting staff shall be recruited to come at par with the AICTE norms within one year.
- (4) No new course shall be started in the Engineering College without the prior approval of the AICTE.
- (5) The intake in any year in any of the AICTE approved courses shall not be altered without the prior approval of the

- (6) For considering approval of any other educational institutions run by the same Society or its sister organisation, the academic performance of this institution and the progress made by the Management in removing the deficiencies will be taken into consideration.
- (7) The Management including the Governing Council of the College shall be constituted as per the AICTE guidelines and also the Chairman shall be appointed as per the AICTE guidelines.
- (8) Admissions shall be made on merit as per the guidelines issued by the AICTE and no capitation or donation of any kind shall be charged for admissions.
- (9) The tuition and other fees shall be charged as prescribed by the State Government within the overall criteria prescribed by the AICTE from time to time.
- (10) The teaching staff shall be recruited on an All India basis by open selection, and as per procedure, qualifications, experience, etc. as prescribed by the AICTE from time to time. State-based selection would be permissible for such posts for which the State Government prescribes "State-based selection" as a general policy.
- (11) The accounts of the College shall be audited by a Chartered Accountant and be open for inspection by the AICTE or anybody authorized by it.
- (12) The College shall follow strictly any further conditions as may be laid down by the AICTE from time to time.

This approval is also subject to full compliance with the SCHEME as prescribed by the Supreme Court in its judgement dated 4.2.1993 on W.P.(C) No. 607 of 1992 with other WPs in the case of Unnikrishnan, J.P. and other etc. etc. vs State of Andhra Pradesh and others etc. etc. and the related guidelines and criteria as may be issued by the AICTE, UGC or the Central Government from time to time.

In the event of non-compliance by the Society or the College with the above conditions, the AICTE will be free to take measures for the closure of the programme and withdrawal of its approval without consideration of any related issues and that all liabilities due to closure would be that of the Society and/or the College.

An Expert Committee of the Western Regional Committee (WRC) will visit the College in December, 1994 to assess compliance with the above conditions.
