


## <u>Detailed Reports of events/activities held during</u> <u>academic year 2018-2019</u>



It was the 3rd inter-collegiate edition of the BSD. This year saw the participation of 40 teams. KJSCE has always strived to better the quality of debaters and inculcate a debating culture in the college. Hence, this year too, selection rounds were held to pick out the best 6 teams from the 18 participating teams from KJSCE.

The Oxford format form of debating was followed. The motions explored subject matters like religion, politics, theology, philosophy, and many more. The debates proved as a test of oratory, reasoning and analytical skills for the debaters. The debaters were scored on the basis of their conviction in speaking, body language, organisation of thought, and command over the language by experienced adjudicators who are well experienced and well-known in the debating circuits. The inauguration ceremony and Round of 40 were conducted on Day 1. Renowned author Mr. Ashwin Sanghi graced the inauguration ceremony and gave an impressive speech which truly motivated the wide audience present at the auditorium.

Each team got 3 debates in total, that were moderated by 3 different adjudicators. This was done to ensure that the overall performance of a debater was taken into account for determining the results. The top 16 teams chosen on the basis of the results, qualified to the Round of 16 on Day 2 which was a knockout round. Day 2 consisted of the Round of 16, Quarter Finals, Semi-finals, Third Place Round, and the Finals.

The debates were captivating and there was truly an atmosphere of arguments surrounding the audience present. The topics chosen for argumentation were based on the current scenario of the nation and thus they were a food for thought for the young generation. After challenging debates and neck to neck competition, four teams excelled and managed to get a place at the semi-finals. 

# Parvaah: The Social initiative of KJSCE Activities from June to December 2018

#### 1) Tree Plantation Drive

#### 6) Signal Shala

Parvaah, the social initiative of K.J. Somaiya College of Engineering has been consistently active with charity-work and has always supported social causes. It joined hands with the Signal Shala Foundation on the 18th and 19th of January to spread awareness regarding Parvaah's three-year-long initiative of creating a zero-waste community and reducing the amount of waste being generated. This was the second consecutive year for this project. Signal Shala is a not-for-profit organisation that functions under the flyover located at *Teen Haat Naka*, Thane and has rehabilitated the children of poverty-ridden citizens of the locality to educate them. With the aim of spreading awareness at the 180-second traffic signal, the students of Signal Shala enacted a skit taught to them by the volunteers of Parvaah. Parvaah's visit to Signal Shala was a two-day-long event with the Day 1 comprising of activities where the volunteers taught the acting pieces to the children and the Day 2 included the implementation of these pieces.

The acting pieces revolved around the 5 R's-Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Refuse, and Rot. Anywhere from three to four children of the foundation, under the supervision of a Parvaah member acted out these pieces during the red signal. Various props such as cloth bags, mobile phones, plastic bags, plastic bottles, etc. were used during the enactments along with Parvaah placards promoting the 5 R's. A few words were written on these placards in English as well as Marathi. The phrases used that were used are written below:

Refuse: Say no to plastic bags.
